

Types of Conjunctions

1. Coordinating Conjunctions: Joins words, phrases and independent clauses

Examples:

The park is empty now, but it will be filled with children after school. He was very intelligent, yet his grades were poor. Conjunctions:

2. Subordinating Conjunctions

Introduces a dependent clause and ties it to an independent clause Examples: If you leave, I will be lonely. Whenever we run out of cookies, I am sad. Conjunctions:

3. Correlative Conjunctions

A pair of conjunctions that must be used together Examples: I either want ice cream or yogurt. He would rather drive around lost than ask for directions. Conjunctions:
